The work is just provided to help you along and please do not feel under any pressure to complete it all. We are all learning in many different ways at the moment and whatever suits best in your home, suits me fine too!

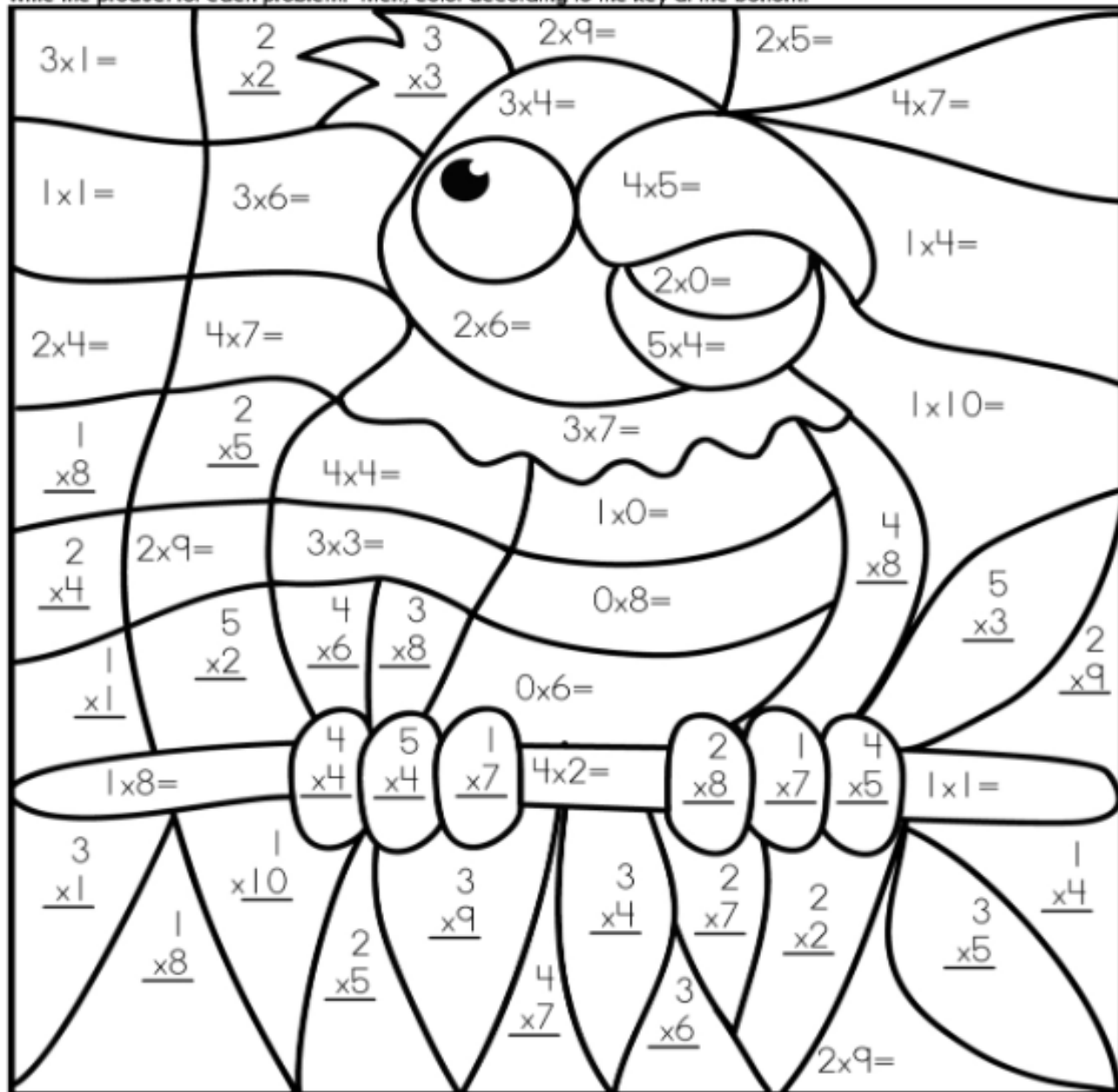
